Spencerport High School Students Collect Goods for East House

What can you say about young people today? They're wonderful! Particularly those in the Spencerport High School Class of 2008, who collected seventeen large boxes of canned and boxed food items to benefit East House. East House serves local individuals who are recovering from mental illness and chemical dependency. The project was coordinated by seniors Dominic Coco, Phil Baglio and Nick Terenza, who led the collection as a project for their "Participation in Government" Class.

"We wanted to support a local organization that helps people in recovery," said project leader Dominic Coco. "We found East House on the internet, and felt it was just the kind of local organization we wanted to help." More than 300 members of the class came together to do just that. The boys delivered the whole host of items to East House on January 17th.

East House is a private, non-profit rehabilitation agency. Founded in 1966, East House provides residential, rehabilitation and support services to individuals recovering from mental illness and/or chemical dependency. East House serves more than 1,300 clients and their families each year and is funded by New York State, Monroe County, United Way, client fees and donations.
